

Our Commitment to Integrity and Transparency

TARA Foundation is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit, and we take seriously our responsibility to act in the best interest of the people and communities we serve. To that end, our Board of Directors has adopted a formal Conflict of Interest Policy that applies to every director, officer, employee, committee member, key volunteer, and health provider or coach engaged by the Foundation.

Everyone covered by the Policy is required to disclose any financial, personal, or professional relationship that could create an actual, potential, or perceived conflict with their work on behalf of TARA. When a possible conflict is identified, the person involved steps aside from the discussion and decision, and the remaining board or committee members review the matter to determine what is fair, reasonable, and in the Foundation's best interest. Every covered person signs an annual acknowledgement and disclosure statement, and the Board reviews the Policy each year.
